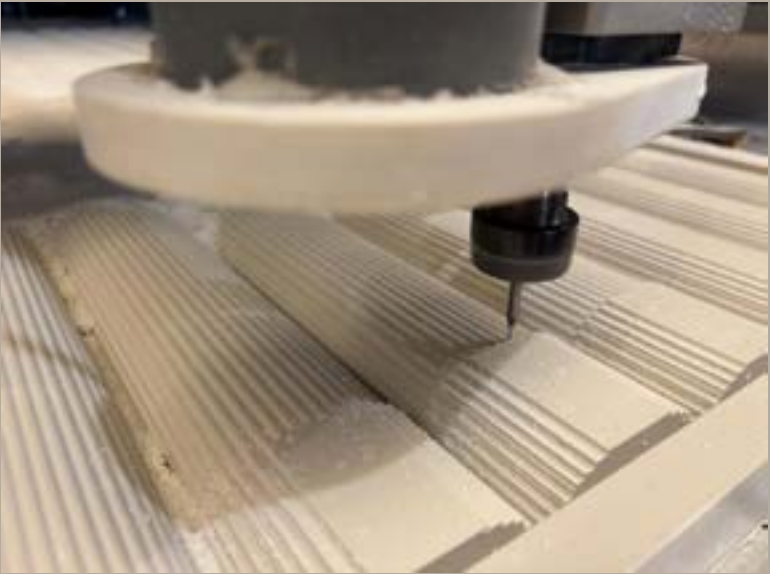

PULL & BEAR / INDITEX GROUP

A bespoke façade developed by Archipanel LAB.

For Pull&Bear at the Isla Azul shopping centre, international architecture practice Broadway Malyan designed a distinctive interior façade: a continuous geometric surface with a strong visual impact.

The project called for a bespoke solution that could follow a curved structure and meet the technical, aesthetic and dimensional demands of a large-scale retail installation.

Archipanel LAB developed an Ad Hoc component exclusively for this project, managing every stage from technical development to manufacturing and quality control.





The challenge went beyond producing a bespoke component. Each unit had to work within a larger system, remaining lightweight and precise while creating a seamless, consistent finish across a curved façade.

Development explored the geometry, connection and installation systems, material behaviour, finishes, visual effect and dimensional tolerances required for series production.



The result is a striking architectural envelope, where repeated elements create rhythm, depth and shifting reflections. Light catches each plane differently, bringing the façade to life as a dynamic volume along the shopping route.





This project demonstrates Archipanel LAB's ability to turn a specific architectural need into a precise, distinctive solution ready for industrial production.

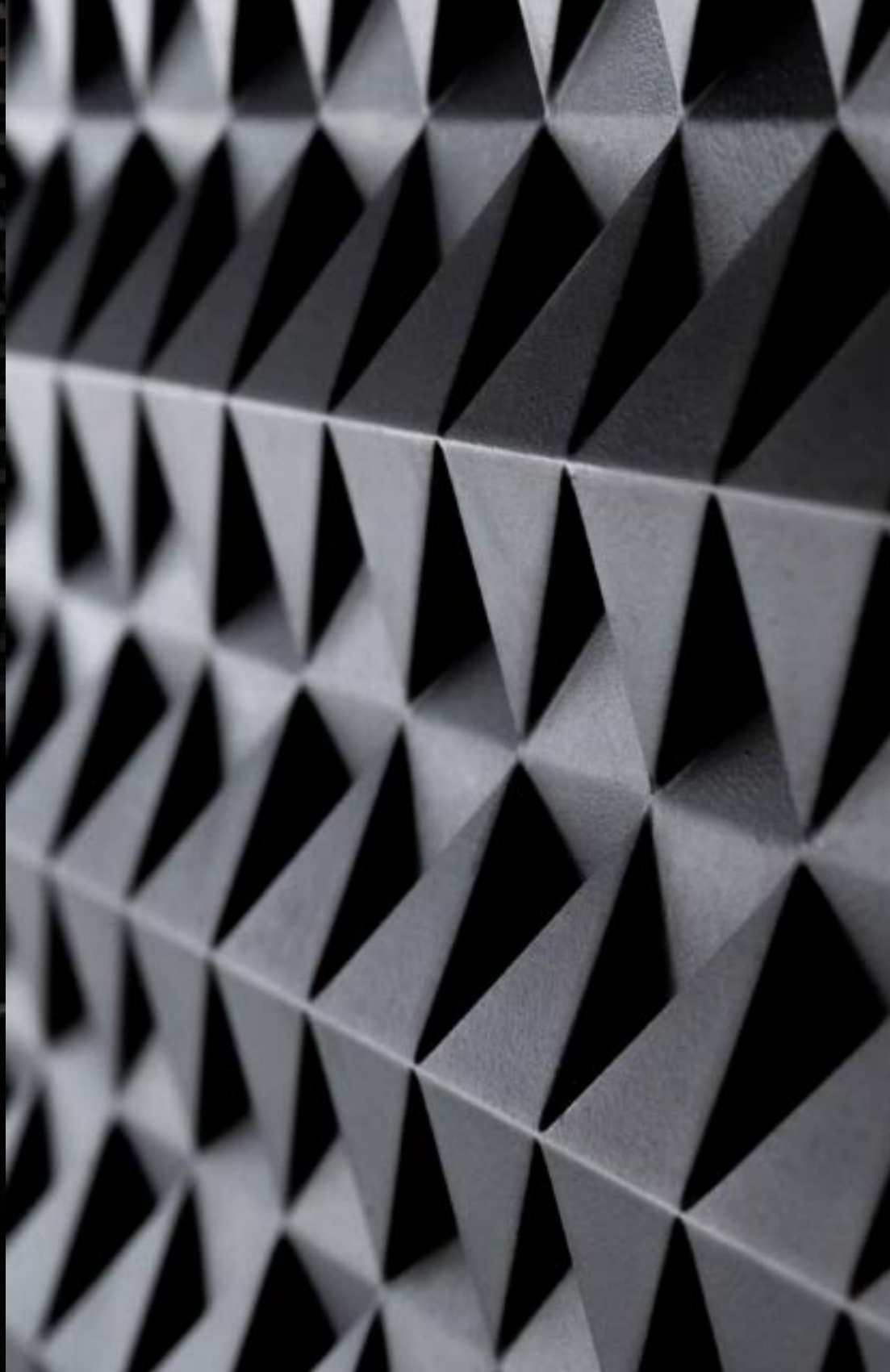

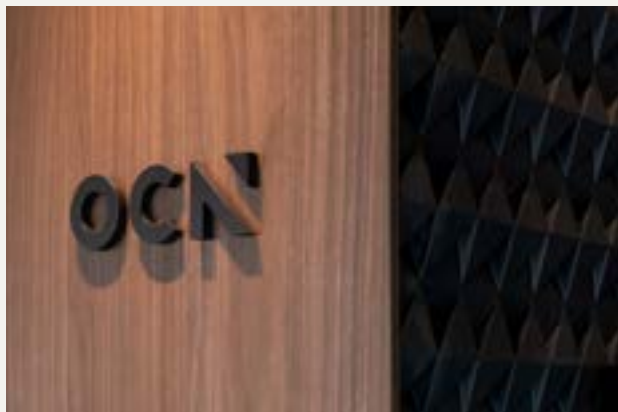

OCN's new headquarters in Castellón represents more than a change of address. It gives architectural form to a way of working.

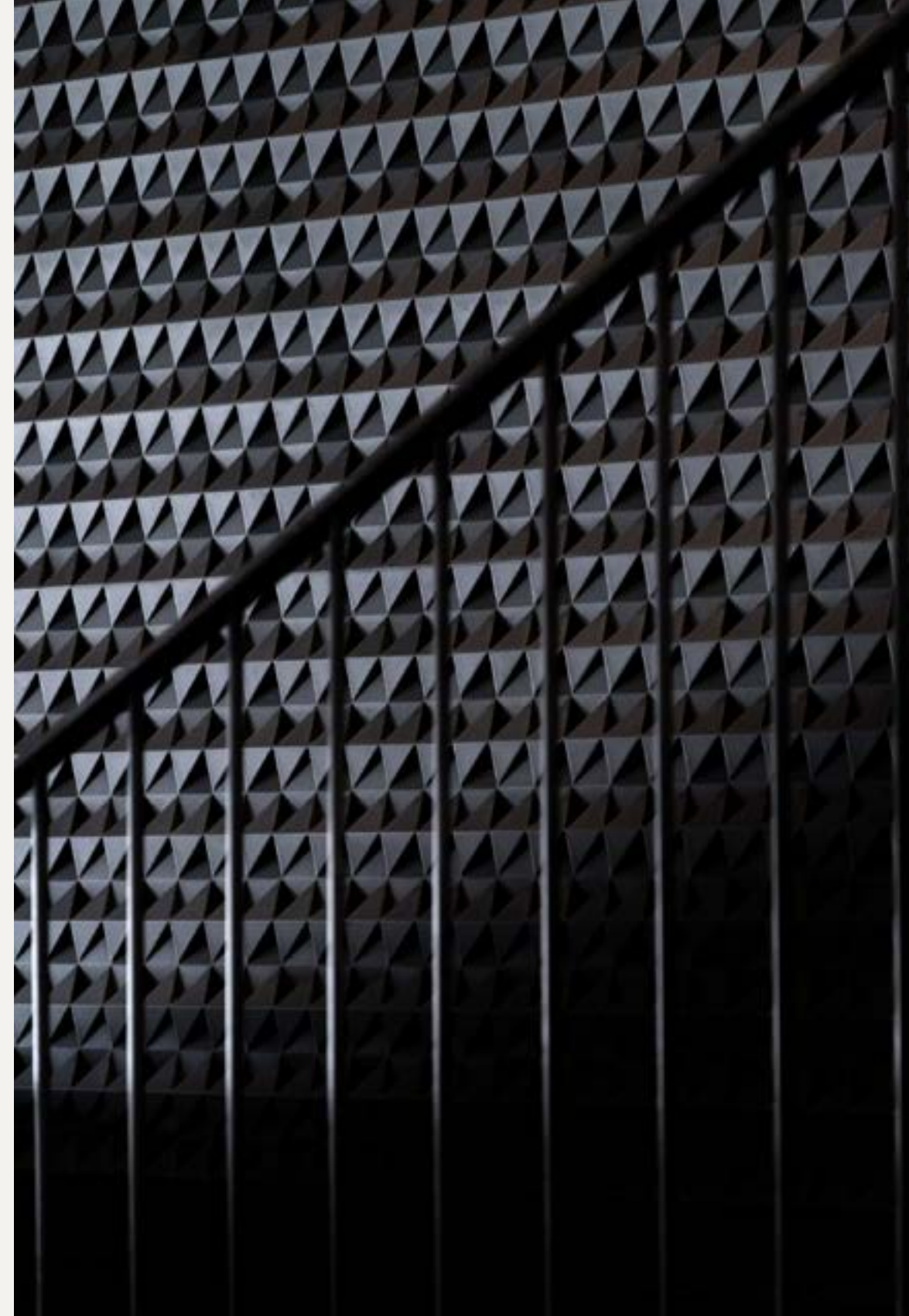
Specialising in high-value projects such as hotels, build-to-rent, coliving and corporate spaces, the construction company opens a 1,250 m² building designed by ERRE Arquitectura. It is built to the same exacting technical standards the company applies to its clients' projects.

Archipanel's TESSEL panel forms an architectural surface that adds texture and depth while preserving the understated character of the whole.





At OCN's new headquarters, the panel becomes a natural extension of the setting: a surface that speaks of construction, method and the value of revealing what usually lies behind a well-executed project.



ANAFORD HEAD OFFICE

Valencia

In central Valencia, Anaford's offices translate the firm's identity into a calm, warm and carefully considered space. The project follows a clear idea: a reception that makes an elegant, precise first impression.

The interior combines the character of the original building with a contemporary design language. Light, timber, sandy tones and curved forms create an atmosphere of trust and sophistication.

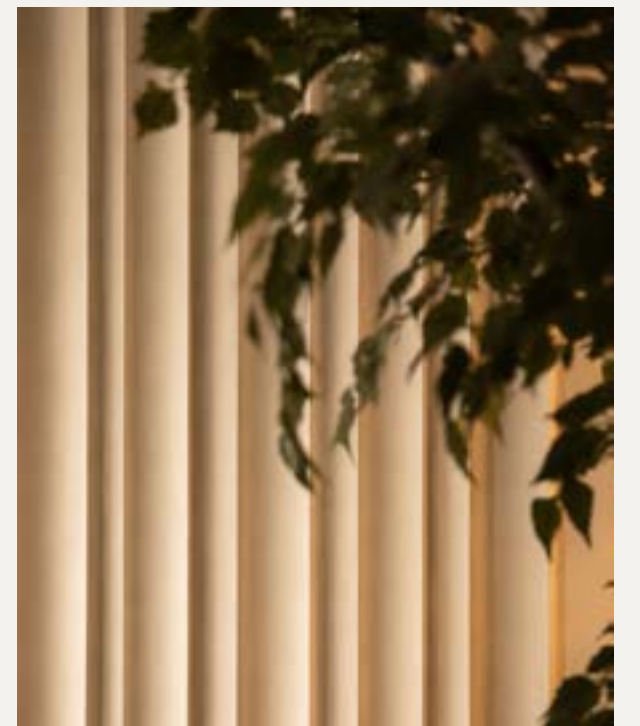
Archipanel's ONA panel, designed by Fran Silvestre, plays a key role in defining the character of the space.





Its vertical composition brings rhythm, depth and architectural clarity, wrapping walls and entrances in a continuous texture that complements the linear lighting, wall lights and indoor planting.

ONA's geometry adds presence while keeping the atmosphere soft. It organises the surface, eases transitions between areas and reinforces the sense of calm throughout the project.





A surface that guides the entrance, frames the reception and makes the wall an active part of the visitor experience.

MOBA ARQUITECTURA

An architect's studio is more than a workplace. It is also an introduction: a space that reveals a way of seeing, organising, designing and understanding materials.

At MOBA Arquitectura's studio, Archipanel's MINERALS panel, designed by Ramón Esteve, brings a strong sculptural presence, turning the wall into an active element within the space.





Its irregular relief, inspired by mineral textures and the transformation of natural matter, introduces depth, shadow and an almost stone-like quality. Light catches each plane differently, creating a shifting surface that complements the studio's rhythm without dominating it.



H O T E L S

Identity and distinction.

A hotel's design should be distinctive and comfortable to inhabit.

From the lobby to a guest room, an event space or a corridor, every surface shapes the overall perception of the brand.

At Archipanel, our panels bring continuity, depth and a clear material identity. They can form calm architectural backdrops, create focal points at headboards, receptions and shared spaces, or introduce rhythm and distinguish one area from another.

HOTEL MELIA RIA

Aveiro, Portugal

A HOTEL SHAPED BY WATER.

Some cities reveal themselves through their streets. Aveiro reveals itself through water.

Between the canals and the lagoon landscape, Meliá Ria Hotel & Spa enjoys a prime position in Cais da Fonte Nova, close to the historic centre. This contemporary hotel connects urban life, landscape and wellbeing.

Its spa extends that connection through an experience centred on rest and care. In the relaxation area, Archipanel's DUNE panel, designed by Kensaku Oshiro, finds a particularly fitting setting.

Our Japanese designer conceived DUNE from a broad curved surface, exploring the relationship between architecture, surroundings and natural light.

At the hotel, its vertical relief, blue finish and the way light travels across each plane bring Aveiro's waterside character indoors.

The panel wraps the room, follows the furniture's flowing lines and transforms the walls into a calm, continuous architectural surface.



SH VALENCIA PALACE

Valencia

Design: VENTURE EXPERIENCE

Facing the Palau de la Música beside the former Turia riverbed, SH Valencia Palace holds a key place in Valencia's cultural and social life.

This five-star hotel combines hospitality with a busy programme of celebrations, business gatherings and major events.

Among its refurbished spaces, the Salón Jardín offers bright, flexible architecture designed to adapt to every arrangement. Here, Archipanel's GRADIENT panel, designed by Cory Grosser, adds an unexpected dimension.



Inspired by lenticular images, GRADIENT changes with the viewer's position. As visitors move through the room, its vertical planes appear to alternate between aqua green and white, transforming the wall from a static surface.

The sequence of panels brings order to the large room, echoes the rhythm of the ceiling beams and creates a continuous envelope that changes with light, movement and viewpoint.



In the Salón Jardín, GRADIENT goes beyond wall cladding. It brings the architecture to life, making movement through the room part of the experience.

HOTEL EXPERIENCE

Athens

Hotel Experience brings architects, designers, hoteliers, developers and brands together around one question: how do we design hospitality spaces that leave a lasting impression?

Here, Nikos Patiris presents an installation in which CRESCENDO, designed by Luca Pevere, becomes an essential part of the atmosphere.

CRESCENDO creates an elegant, precise linear relief, adding depth without overwhelming the space. Its modular composition allows for large surfaces, geometric patterns, decorative panelling, cornices and subtler wall and ceiling treatments, all based on repetition, proportion and continuity.

In the installation, grazing light brings the relief to life, turning the wall into an ever-changing surface.



R E S T A U R A N T S

Surfaces that shape experiences.

In a restaurant, the space speaks before the menu.

The first impression, visual warmth, light falling on a wall and the sense of intimacy or openness all form part of the dining experience.

Our panels create distinctive atmospheres without excess. Relief, depth and rhythm make spaces more immersive, memorable and true to the culinary concept.

In restaurants, cafés and hospitality venues, we help surfaces tell the story of the place: a warmer gesture, a more precise geometry, a wall that brings order or a volume that adds character without dominating.

FARALÁ RESTAURANT

(Michelin - starred)

Granada

A SURFACE ROOTED IN THE EARTH

At the foot of the Alhambra, on one of the streets leading to its gardens, Faralá offers a dining experience deeply connected to Granada.

Its cuisine takes a contemporary view of local tradition, rediscovering the province's flavours, produce and cultural references in a new culinary language. This relationship between memory and the present extends to an interior where materials play an essential role.

In the dining room, Archipanel's MINERALS panel, designed by Ramón Esteve, covers the main wall to create a distinctly sculptural backdrop.



Born from the meeting of geometry and organic forms, MINERALS enlarges mineral textures to an architectural scale. Its irregular relief catches the overhead light, creating shifting patterns of light and shadow that add depth to an interior defined by timber, natural tones and the original columns.

The panel complements the existing architecture, adding a new material layer that sits between carved stone, atmosphere and abstraction.

At Faralá, MINERALS turns the wall into a contemporary surface that seems to have been shaped by time.



ALMARA RESTAURANT / Grupo La Fábrica

THE MEDITERRANEAN, FAR FROM THE SHORE

On Paseo de la Castellana, Almara brings Madrid a sense of the Mediterranean that goes beyond visual references.

Designed by Pablo Baruc, this Grupo La Fábrica restaurant builds its identity around the sea, produce and relaxed hospitality. Mineral tones, lime, light and a palette inspired by the southern landscape create a warm, contemporary interior that avoids a themed approach.



Within this interior, Archipanel's ONA panel, designed by Fran Silvestre, introduces rhythm and depth through a strongly vertical composition.

Its slender elements, formed from curves of varying radii, create a continuous surface that shifts subtly with the light and the viewer's movement. The relief brings the walls to life and complements the project's Mediterranean character without literal references.



ONA's geometry gives the surface order while softening its appearance. Its consistent shadows create a subtle visual rhythm that complements the restaurant's materials, light and natural tones.



ONA brings a calm rhythm to the dining room, turning the wall into a living surface shaped by light and movement.

GONDOLIERE RESTAURANTS

Málaga and Granada

ITALIAN IDENTITY EXPRESSED IN RELIEF

Il Gondoliere has grown without losing its character. Founded in Granada, the group has built a distinctive identity around Italian cuisine, hospitality and increasingly considered interiors.

With restaurants in Granada and Marbella, each venue has its own personality. All share one aim: to bring Italian tradition into a warm, contemporary setting with a strong sense of theatre.

In this project, developed by Dinarq Studio with design by Marina Mora, Archipanel's FOLD panel, designed by Víctor Carrasco, plays a key role in shaping the atmosphere.



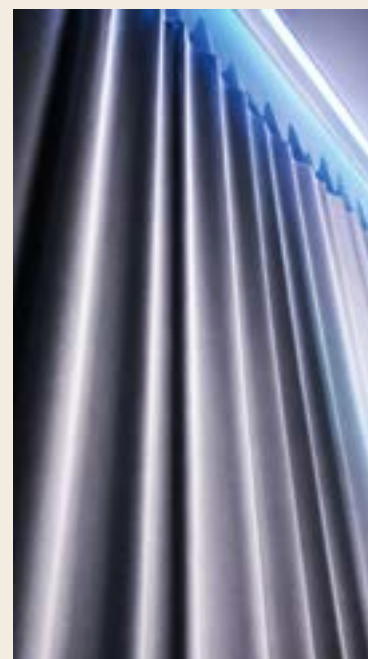


Its vertical relief creates a continuous, almost textile-like surface, giving counters, bars and walls architectural presence.

The panel's geometry adds rhythm, depth and movement. Lighting accentuates its folds and changes its appearance with the finish, view-point and colour temperature.

In gold, FOLD feels sophisticated and vibrant, echoing the bar, gleaming glass, reflections and the restaurant's energy at night.

In cooler tones, with blue and violet lighting, the panel takes on a more enveloping, almost theatrical quality, making the surface an active part of the experience.



H E A L T H A N D W E L L N E S S S P A C E S

In clinics, medical centres, beauty salons and wellness spaces, interior design has a particularly sensitive role: to welcome people with calm, visual clarity and reassurance.

Beyond creating pleasant spaces, the aim is to shape settings where the first impression eases tension, makes the experience intuitive and conveys professionalism from the outset.

Archipanel transforms receptions, waiting rooms, treatment rooms and circulation areas with architectural surfaces that offer presence, texture and depth. The relief adds character without overwhelming, creating serene, uncluttered and memorable interiors.

In these projects, materials can become a tool for wellbeing. A wall can make waiting more comfortable. A reception can convey precision. A room can feel warmer, more human and more thoughtfully designed.

Clínica González Font, Maxilofacial Clinic

Málaga

A WAITING ROOM DESIGNED TO EASE THE PULSE

In a clinic, architecture does more than organise space. It also helps patients feel at ease.

Clínica González Font & Maxilofacial Clinic operates in Málaga and Cártama, with a team specialising in oral and maxillofacial surgery, restorative and paediatric dentistry, endodontics, implants, prosthodontics and cosmetic dentistry. Its philosophy centres on specialist expertise, experience, honesty, service quality, advanced equipment and personal care.

The interior creates a carefully restrained atmosphere: warm light, clean volumes, neutral tones and a sense of seclusion make waiting a more comfortable experience.

Archipanel's DUNE panel, designed by Kensaku Oshiro, gives the waiting room a calm, enveloping surface. Its vertical relief adds rhythm and depth to the walls, while perimeter lighting highlights the texture and softens the space.





DUNE is particularly suited to a healthcare setting where calm, precision and trust are essential to the experience. The panel creates continuity rather than a focal point: it guides movement, brings visual order to the room and adds architectural comfort while preserving the clarity of the whole.

MÁLAGA DENTAL CLINIC

Málaga

Design: LAGO INTERIORIZA
Collection: CRESCENDO

In this project, Lago Interioriza creates a warm, understated and carefully balanced reception area, where the patient's experience begins before the consultation.

Moving away from the cold image traditionally associated with healthcare settings, the interior offers a more welcoming, enveloping and serene atmosphere. Timber, indirect lighting and a natural palette create a space in which every material contributes to a sense of calm and professionalism.

Archipanel's CRESCENDO panel plays a key role in this spatial composition.





Setting the panels at different heights creates a dynamic surface, using vertical repetition to organise the wall visually and reinforce the project's identity.

Overhead lighting accentuates CRESCENDO's volume, allowing the wall to shift subtly with the light. As part of a wider spatial strategy, the panel adds warmth, softens the perceived scale and gives the waiting and reception areas a discreet yet distinctive presence.

General dimensional tolerance: ±5 mm.
Design feature tolerance: ±3 mm.

Our panels are made using a sustainable manufacturing process. Minor imperfections, including those caused by transport or handling, can be easily repaired with standard filler, similar to high-performance plaster.

Once installed, panels can be filled and repainted, making maintenance easier and extending their service life.

We recommend installation by carpenters or cabinetmakers, as our panels are handled in a similar way to timber panels.

ARCHIPANELS supplies panels without fire-resistance certification. If fire-retardant panels are required, an appropriate treatment must be applied after installation and before the final coat of paint.

Images used in our catalogues and on our website may show real projects, studio photography or computer-generated scenes. This may cause slight differences in the perceived colour or texture. We recommend requesting physical samples from your local sales representative to confirm finishes before making a final decision.
